Illovo Pulls out of Mali Sugar Project on Security Concerns



Illovo Sugar Ltd., Africa's largest sugar producer, said it has ended its involvement in the Markala sugar project in Mali because of incomplete funding and a deteriorating security situation in the West African nation.

The project involves the development of a plantation that would produce 190,000 metric tons of sugar and 15 million liters of ethanol a year, according to the United Nations food agency. The government was expected to contribute about \$240 million to develop the agricultural component of the project, while private companies would spend about \$300 million on an industrial component, including a sugar mill and ethanol plant, the Romebased Food and Agricultural Organization said on its website.
