Mere grow timber for its own business, as well as contract grow for companies and institutions.

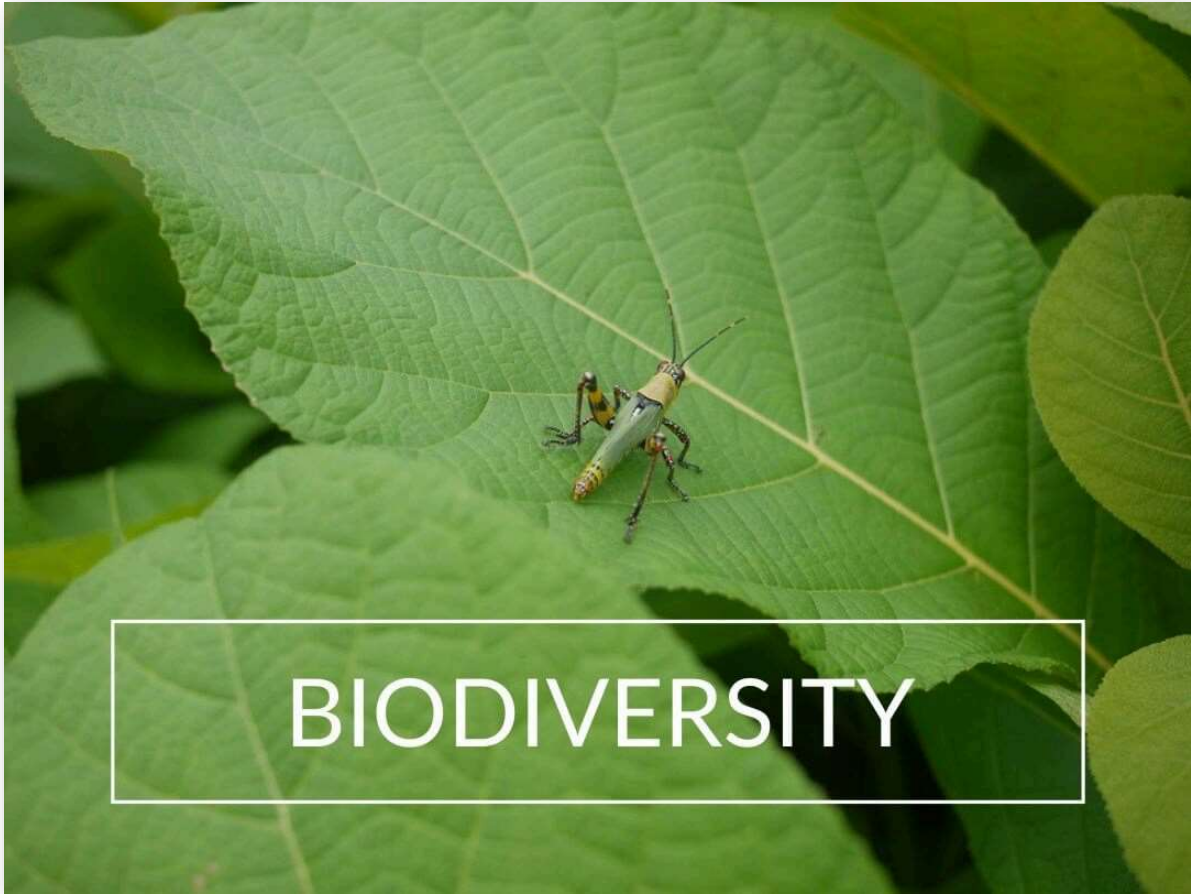

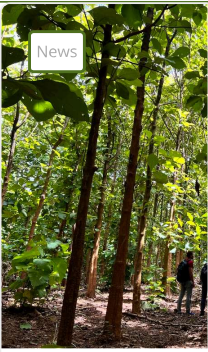
