The National Assembly Facinated by the Phnom Penh's Potential

With the grand permission by Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padey Techo HUN SEN, Prime Minister of Kingdom of Cambodia, and H.E SAR Kheng, the Minister of the Ministry of Interior, in the morning of March 16th, 2011, H.E KEP Chuk Tema, the Phnom Penh Governor, led the Capital working team to report to the nine National Assembly commissions at the National Assembly Hall follow by the invitation of H.E CHEAM Yiep, Chairman of the 2nd Commission. Notable attendants at this meeting included H.E BUN Sam, Under Secretary of State for the Ministry of Economics and Finances and H.E CHHAY Kim, Under Secretary-General of the National Audition of Cambodia and their assistants are also present.

During that meeting, $\mathbf{H.E}$ CHEAM Yiep had stated that this was the first occasion for a National Assembly technical commission to invite H.E Governor and his assistants to report aiming at comprehending all activities, roles and duties provided for H.E Governor. Day by day, all fields have been developed, Phnom Penh image has been so well beautified that it impresses the public nationally and internationally. The National Assembly members including H.E CHEAM Yiep, Chairman of the meeting expressed his enthusiasm over the achievements in Phnom Penh and regarded H.E KEP Chuk Tema as one of the Royal Governor heroes in serving our nation to reach what we are seeing today.




Following the agenda, H.E Governor delivered the report of potential revenue and expenditure of the Phnom Penh Capital Hall. Basically, there are two main source of revenues: taxation and non-taxation. Technically, tax collection is normally conducted by a technical institution namely Department of Customs and Taxes while the Phnom Penh only assumes its administrative and political responsibility regarding the tax issue. H.E Governor expressed his thankfulness to the meeting participants for their enthusiasm over the accomplishments of Phnom Penh adding that such outcome could not be fulfilled by the Capital Hall alone but also with the support from the nation as a whole particularly under the wise leadership of Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo HUN SEN, the Legislative Power as well as people in

During the discussion session, beside the potential revenues of Phnom Penh, the National Assembly

commission members in charge of the development projects for Boeung Kak and Beoung Tumpun, particularly H.E CHEAM Yiep also was deeply interested in implementing the development projects and the impact at the major development zones in Phnom Penh including Boeung Kak and construction of Samdech HUN SEN Boulevard in Boeung Cheung Ek and Boeung Tumpun project.

Responding to these concerns, H.E KEP Chuk Tema stressed that up to the date, we have compensated to most of the Beoung Kak residents, only 1,000 out of 4,000 houses

had yet been in process. Meanwhile, we had also been observing those protests (against the development) which were stirred up by a small number of residents who are not satisfied with the resolution proposed by the company and seek to gain possession of the land with the incitement from some major land owners. Regarding the development projects in Boeung Cheung Ek and Boeung Tumpun, the Capital Hall requested to the developing company to thoroughly study and cooperate with the Capital's relevant technical agencies as well as other concerned departments. Mainly, these natural lakes have been served as a circulated ponds for polluted water from various parts of the city. H.E. Governor stated that in sum, so far in fulfilling our duties and performing our activities, we always stick to principles of laws and other legal norms so that our conduct remains on the legal track. Hence, this factor had proudly made us achieve to the current situation.





At the end of the meeting, H.E Chairman of the meeting expressed his deep and profound appreciation to the Phnom Penh Capital Hall, particularly H.E Governor who had provided priceless experiences to the today's discussion . Finally, H.E CHEAM Yiep also would like to suggest some recommendations to the audience as following

- Relevant institutions should take more consideration on all kinds of revenues by educating, strengthening, laying down principles and necessary measures so that the concerned technical officials can effectively and efficiently fulfill their work to increase the overall national revenue. Moreover, he urged that the National Audit Authority should continue strengthening their auditing activities.
- Implementation of law, public procurement should be harmonized by all relevant institutions so that they are more effective.
- Alert all tax payers about their tax obligation especially the tax on unused land and urge them to pay the tax accordingly and timely.
- Department of Customs and Taxes should clearly differentiate their duties between customs and taxes to avoid overlapping work.
- All institutions shall implements all laws adopted by the National Assembly to avoid the comment that laws still remain on paper and are never in practice.
