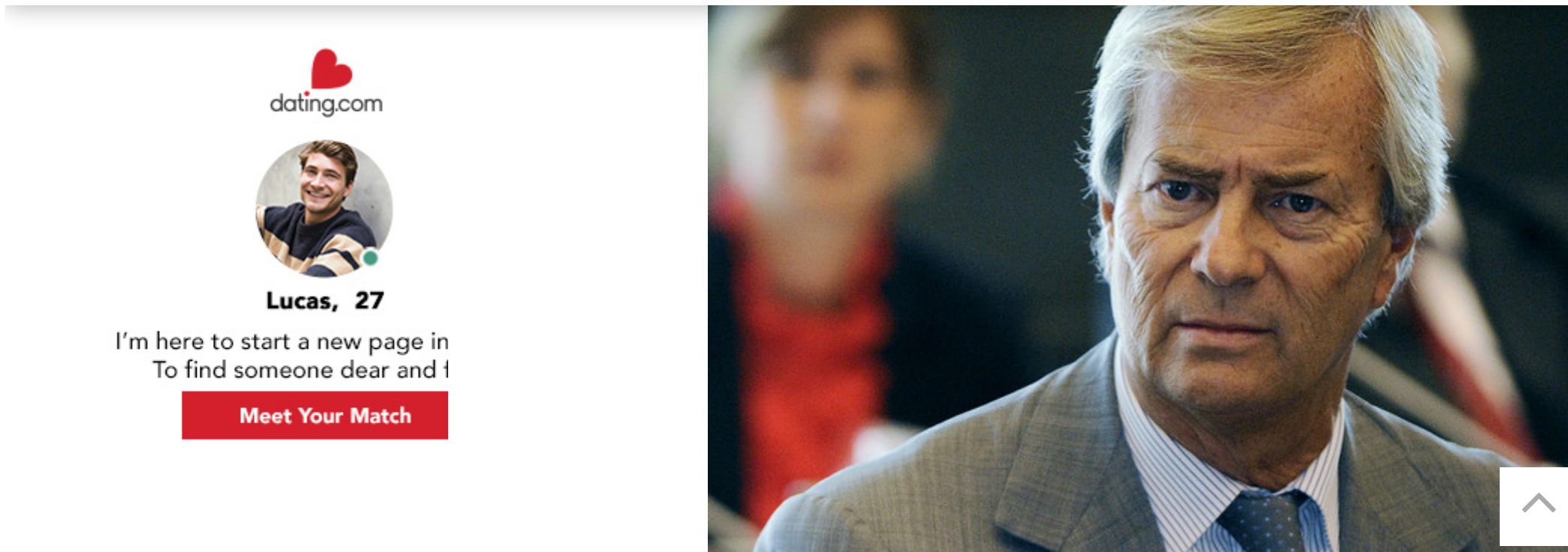
Palm groves in Cameroon: 145 residents against the Bolloré rejected in France

Some 145 Cameroonians were rejected Friday by the French justice when they wanted group to provide documents supposed to establish its links with a Cameroonian accuse of attacking their rights.

According to their lawyer, Fyodor Rilov, the exploitation of palm groves by the Can Socapalm "inflicts daily harm on them" by condemning access to land and burial sites the waters.

At the end of November, Mr Rilov had tried to convince the court of Nanterre (Paris 1) to order the Bolloré group to produce documents supposed to attest either to the control it exercised over the commercial relations established with it via a Belgian-Luxembourg holding company, Société financière des caoutchoucs (Socfin).

If this were the case, the French giant would be subject to the "duty of vigilance" regarding its activities in Cameroon. A 2017 law obliges the largest companies to prevent serious environmental abuses by their foreign subcontractors and suppliers.

On Friday, the judge hearing the application for interim measures considered that Socapalm could be "likely to infringe the fundamental rights" of local residents. But the residents did not provide "any element of such a nature as to presume the existence of an indirect control by Bolloré SE over Socapalm or Socfin".

The judge accepted the arguments of the Bolloré group's defence, namely its minority to 38.75%. The lawyer of the group, Olivier Baratelli, welcomed this judicial victory AFP a procedure aimed at "demonizing and trying to use the notoriety of the name Bo

For his part, Fyodor Rilov told AFP that his clients would appeal. "We do not capital participation," recalled the lawyer, who wonders above all about the "dominance the Bolloré group in the appointment of socfin's directors."

In May 2019, ten NGOs and trade unions sued Bolloré in France to obtain the measures improving the living conditions of workers and residents of palm oil plants. This procedure, distinct from that of the 145 residents, is ongoing.

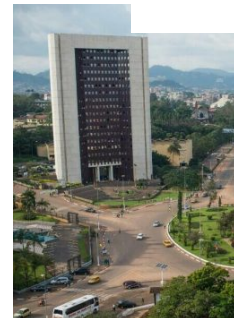

These allegations could not be independently verified and Ethiopian government officials refused to respond immediately to AFP's requests. Access to Tigray is restricted and communications are cut in the region.

However, an official at the main hospital in Mekele, Tigray's capital, told AFP that the number of victims of the attack in Shire, where the victims were evacuated, reported 55 dead and 126 injured. Getachew Reda said the attack took place.

The TPLF has been confronting forces loyal to Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed since November. A brutal conflict that has left thousands dead and caused a serious humanitarian crisis. The TPLF withdrew to their Tigray stronghold in late December, after a military offensive that saw government forces retake a series of strategic towns.

Fighting has seen some lull since the TPLF withdrew, although rebels are continuing to carry out deadly drone attacks on Tigray, Ethiopia's northernmost region. The Ethiopian government reported this week that three Eritrean refugees, including two children, were killed in an attack on a Tigray refugee camp on Wednesday.

The region is subject to what the UN has described as a de facto blockade, which prevents access to basic necessities to its six million inhabitants.

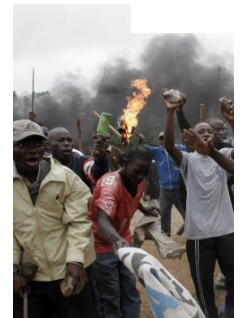
